

Dear Family: in class today, we explored how germs travel by making a class “sneeze” painting.

Did you know?

- Germs can travel when you sneeze.
- Traveling germs can make you sick.
- Covering your mouth when you sneeze can help to keep germs from spreading.

Ask your child:

- Explain how you made a “sneeze” painting.
- Describe how far the spray traveled.
- Tell me a good way to keep germs from spreading.

Vocabulary:

- sneeze – to let out a sudden loud burst of air through the mouth and nose.
- germs – a very, very small living thing that can cause illness.
- cover – to put something over something else to protect it.
- imitate – to copy the actions of.
- spread – to open or stretch wide.
- pretend – to imagine or make believe.

Activity:

On a sheet of paper, help your child write or draw one thing they can do to keep germs from spreading. Send the paper to school to share with us.
