**Did You Know?**

- Lines are an element of art.
- Lines can be different—flat, thick, thin, straight, bent, wiggly, parallel—or they can cross each other.
- Lines can work together to make a drawing.

**Ask Your Child:**

- Tell me where we can find lines.
- Describe different kinds of lines.
- Explain how you made your drawing.

**Activities To Do With Your Child:**

- Gather some markers, crayons, colored pencils, and paper, and draw different kinds of lines with your child. Send the picture to school to share with us.

**Vocabulary To Use With Your Child:**

- **line** – a continuous mark made by a moving point.
- **element** – a basic part of a whole.
- **wiggle** – to move with quick, twisting motions from side to side.
- **straight** – without a curve or bend.
- **bent** – not straight; curved.
- **detective** – a person who finds information to solve problems.
