

Dear Family: In class today, we planted seeds.

Did you know?

- Seeds come from plants.
- Seeds can become small baby plants.
- Seeds need water, air, and sunlight to begin growing.
- Some seeds are on the outside of the plant. Strawberries have seeds on the outside.
- Some seeds grow inside pods.

Ask your child:

- Tell me what you planted in school today.
- Describe what the seed looked like.
- Where did you put your seeds after they were planted?

Vocabulary:

- seed – the small part of a plant with flowers that grows into a new plant.
- soil – dirt.
- plant – to put something into the ground to make it grow.
- grow – to become larger.
- sprout – to start to grow.
- root – the part of a plant that grows under the ground.

Activity:

Help your child find some seeds. The seeds can be from fruit or vegetables in your refrigerator. Seeds can also be found outside. Tape one of the seeds to a piece of paper. Write down the name of the fruit, vegetable, or plant where the seed was found. Send it to school to share with us.
