World-Class Innovation

Centrally located for maximum opportunity, the Cleveland region is within 500 miles of 60% of the Fortune 500. Biomedical industry growth in Cleveland is faster than the norm, with scientific R&D investments double the U.S. average. Our entrepreneurial city is also seeing expansion in professional and technical services, aerospace manufacturing, and alternative energy manufacturing.

Culture and Fun

The area is home to 70 suburban communities such as Lakewood, Parma, Shaker Heights, Cleveland Heights, East Cleveland, Euclid, Garfield Heights, and Rocky River. Each one with a unique offering of restaurants, breweries, music and fun. Cleveland is home to the Rock-n-Roll Hall of Fame, but we also love the Polka, the symphony, museums, and our pro sports teams.

Affordability

The cost of living in Cleveland is 5% less than the Ohio average, and 9% less than the national average. Housing is particularly affordable, with median home prices just over \$130,000.

Sustainability

The Cleveland Foundation works to preserve, protect and restore our region’s environment by funding organizations and projects of all sizes. The Foundation is a leader in improving water quality and advancing clean energy. That means protecting Lake Erie (the source of drinking water for 11+ million people) and positioning Cleveland as the center of offshore wind energy production in the Great Lakes.

Colleges and Universities

The city’s growth in entrepreneurship and innovation has resulted in an influx of college-educated residents. Opportunities for continued learning and exploration include Case Western Reserve University and Cleveland State University, Cleveland Institute of Art, the Cleveland Institute of Music, and Notre Dame College.

Healthcare

U.S. News & World Report ranked the Cleveland Clinic as one of America’s top four hospitals. The organization’s heart care program was #1 in the country for the 19th consecutive year, while 14 other clinical specialties ranked in the top 10. Greater Cleveland is also home to more than 700 biotechnology and biomedical companies with 230,000 employees.
