

# Dow Jones Indices

## Dow Jones Industrial Average Index

The Dow Jones Industrial Average Index measures the performance of all U.S. stocks in the Dow Jones U.S. Index classified into industrials sector. The sector classifications are defined by the proprietary classification system which is used by S&P Dow Jones. It is a free-float weighted index.

## Dow Jones U.S. Index

The Dow Jones U.S. Index measures the performance of all U.S. equity securities with readily available prices. It represents the top 95% of the U.S. stock market based on market capitalization. The index is float-adjusted market capitalization weighted.

## Dow Jones U.S. Select Dividend Index

The Dow Jones U.S. Select Dividend Index measures the performance of leading U.S. dividend-paying companies, based on dividend yield. The securities in this index are dividend-weighted. Securities are capped to prevent one security from dominating the index's constitution.

## Dow Jones U.S. Select REIT Index

The Dow Jones U.S. Select REIT Index measures the performance of publicly traded real estate investment trusts (REITs) and REIT-like securities. The index is a subset of the Dow Jones U.S. Select Real Estate Securities Index (RESI). The index is designed to serve as proxy for direct real estate investment, in part by excluding companies whose performance may be driven by factors other than the value of real estate.

## Dow Jones U.S. Total Stock Market Index

The Dow Jones U.S. Total Stock Market Index measures the performance of all U.S. equity securities with readily available prices. It represents the top 95% of the U.S. stock market based on market capitalization. The index is float-adjusted market capitalization weighted.
